
Whether it is your first visit to the Cook Islands or your fifth, we hope that your time and stay here is the holiday you have been dreaming of.

1) The gate code to access the property


2) The code for the on-site lock-box for the front door key

# HOW TO FIND RED SUNSET VILLA

From the airport – head anticlockwise around the island (turn left onto the main road) and travel approximately 3.5km until you reach the Edgewater Hotel. Continue about 100m beyond the hotel and turn right into a long driveway immediately before a large sign for 'Tumunu' restaurant.

Red Sunset Villa – "Are O Puaikura" is at the very end of the driveway.



# ENTERTAINMENT SYSTEM (PRELOADED MOVIES & TV)

An entertainment system, featuring Moana TV and over 250 preloaded movies and TV shows, is provided for your enjoyment. Operating instructions are located in the cupboard with the remote controls.

#### GATE & SECURITY SYSTEM

Please close the gate when you leave the property using the remote control provided. If desired you can arm and disarm the house alarm using the remote control provided (red button to arm – alarm will sound once, green button to disarm – alarm will sound twice).







Red Sunset Villa comfortably sleeps 10 people. It has five spacious bedrooms, 3 bathrooms, generous living areas inside and out, a well-appointed kitchen and 2 additional toilets (one inside and one attached to the pump room).

Please remember that it is not an event or function centre, it is our home away from home, so this information should be followed:

- No weddings or functions
- No more than 16 people at the villa at any one time

Please put full rubbish bags and recycling in to the wheelie bins inside the garden shed. The bins are clearly labelled. In Rarotonga bottles with caps on will not be collected so it would be appreciated if guests could remove all caps from bottles.

We strive to maintain all facilities and appliances in full working order. Please contact us if something is out of order and we will do our best to rectify the problem as soon as possible.

#### **BEDROOMS**

Bedroom 1: One x Super King

With walk in wardrobe and ensuite

Bedroom 2: Two x Long Single beds

Bedroom 3: One x King bed

Bedroom 4: Two x King Single beds

Bedroom 5: One x King bed

Two luggage racks are situated in each room. Please do not place your luggage on the beds. In our experience your holiday is more enjoyable if you use the ample space in the wardrobe and you store the suitcases in the Store Room, which is near the bedrooms.



All five bedrooms have ranch sliders and insect screens that open on to the verandah. The insect screens can be locked from the inside at night for security, should you wish. There is also a sunblind and a night blind in each bedroom. Each bedroom has an overhead fan, air conditioning unit and an eiderdown and blanket to manage all temperature fluctuations.



#### KITCHEN

The kitchen is fully equipped to make your stay as comfortable as possible. Please follow any instructions that are found in this handbook when using the different appliances.

The bench top is made from Caesarstone.

Please do not place hot items directly on the bench top and avoid abrasive cleaners, vinegar, lemon juice, bleach, red wine and oils, which can damage these

bench tops. Wipe spillages as soon as possible. Caesarstone bench tops can be chipped if subjected to sharp hard objects and spilled oils, if left, will absorb and cause dark patches.

#### WATER & CONSERVATION

The tap water at Red Sunset Villa is fully filtered for your convenience. As water is a precious resource on the Island please conserve water where possible.




#### LAUNDRY


#### BATHROOMS AND TOILETS

There are three bathrooms and five toilets in the Villa. Please do not flush any sanitary items in the toilets, but use the rubbish bins provided.

## SWIMMING POOL

We hope you enjoy our lovely heated salt-water swimming pool, but remember it is your responsibility to keep yourself and fellow guests safe. Please follow usual water safety rules and guidelines.

Sun loungers are provided for your enjoyment.

Please close the sun umbrellas in very windy conditions.

#### SPA

You are welcome to use our salt-water spa. Please do not alter the existing temperature of 39 degrees Celsius.

# AROUND THE VILLA

The linen room will be locked, as well as a separate pantry for Owner's use.

If the lights trip, there is a switchboard in the hallway in front of bedroom 1, the other in the hallway leading to bedrooms 2 and 3.

Some in-house entertainment can be found in the drawers in the lounge. There are also some books in the cupboard in the lounge.

# GENERAL RULES

#### NON-SMOKING POLICY

Smoking is not permitted anywhere in the villa or guest areas. We hope you can respect our choice to make Red Sunset Villa smoke free.

#### DAMAGE POLICY

Any damage anywhere in the villa caused by misuse or carelessness will be the guests responsibility and you will be charged accordingly.

The cost involved will be decided by a quote from the appropriate repair service (e.g. builder, joiner, painter etc.) or by mutual agreement.

Please note loss of house keys or garage remote control will incur a charge. We hope you appreciate this policy, we take great pride in our villa and hope that it continues to meet the high standards that we have created.

#### **PFTS**

We do not allow pets in the Villa or outside on the property.

Please do not feed any chickens or dogs that may have wandered on to the property, as tempting as this may be.

#### SECURITY

Please ensure when going out for the day/evening that the villa is fully locked and that you do not leave your valuables outside the house. Please assist us with energy saving by ensuring the fans and lights are turned off after use.

There is a safe in the villa for your use. The safe is located in the kitchen pantry with operating instructions.

Please note, Red Sunset Villa or its owners accept no responsibility for any loss/damage or injury to guests or their property and we recommend you to arrange your own travel insurance prior to your stay.

# **APPLIANCES**

This is the list of appliances that are in the Villa and any special instructions. Please note that the booklet containing the User Manuals is located in the lounge cupboard. For ease of use, we have included some instructions below or have included a copy of the more popular ones with each appliance.

#### WASHING MACHINE

- Once ready place clothes evenly around the agitator.
- Remove fabric softener dispenser cup.
- Detergent follow the manufacturer's instructions on the detergent bottle.
- Pour detergent down the centre of the agitator stem, and then replace the dispenser cup.

Please see User Manual for instructions.

#### DRYFR

Please follow these instructions before using the dryer.

- Check lint filter is clean before load. Ensure it is placed correctly before using.
  - 1. Press 'Power' to activate your dryer.
  - 2. Touch the >II button to start the cycle.
- The dryer will beep once the cycle has finished. Please see User Manual for instructions.

#### IRON

The iron can be found in the garage cupboard along with the ironing board. To use the steam function, you will need to fill it with water to the correct level. Ensure you have it on the right level for whichever garment you are ironing. After use and once it has cooled, please empty the iron of water and return it to its original home. Please be careful when using the iron, so as not to burn yourself and do not leave it on when unattended.

#### OVFN

- A very simple oven to operate.
- For the Gas Hob; press the knobs down, hold and turn dials to the left.

Please see User Manual for instructions.

#### MICROWAVE/OVEN

Here are some easy instructions for the Microwave/ Oven to follow.

- 1. Press to turn on.
- 2. + Press. This changes the various functions when you continue pressing:

Thin lines	microwave
Fan	fan oven
Left corner, snowflake	defrost
Thick line at top	grill
Thick ½ line at top	½ grill
Thin lines and fan	microwave and fan together
Left corner pan	keep warm

- Press, to start whatever function you've chosen.
   Every press will give you 30 seconds of cooking.
   Continue pressing until you reach the time required
   OR
- 4. Press in the time required using the + button. Always check that you haven't inadvertently put on The Child Safety button (first left button) in which case the microwave will be locked and no programmes are available.

#### FRIDGE/FRFF7FR

Please do not alter the settings on the fridge; they are kept at the optimum temperatures. Please see User Manual for instructions.

#### DISHWASHER

Run programmes when dishwasher is full using the recommended guides on the machine. (See manual if in doubt) If something can't fit or isn't dishwasher safe, please use caution when hand washing or leave for staff to wash.

#### RRO

A Weber BBQ is provided for your use. Please turn the gas off at the bottle after use.

#### AIR CONDITIONING UNITS

To operate, use the remote controls.

Fans: to use, turn the wall switch to I (ON) then use the remote. We have found that levels 1 to 3 are quiet, pleasant and what we recommend they be set at.

To Reset Fan (in the event you can't get it to work)

- 1) Turn fan dial on wall to 0 setting for 30 seconds
- 2) Re turn back to the 1 setting while holding down the fan remotes ON/ OFF button for 5 seconds (top left) This reprograms the fans to make them work again.

# IN CASE OF EMERGENCY



In the unlikely event of a fire or natural disaster please take note of the following safety guides.

#### FIRE SAFETY

There are smoke detectors in each room and two regularly checked fire extinguishers. One can be found in the kitchen area and the other in the laundry in the garage. There is also a fire blanket in the kitchen area.

In the unforeseen event that any have to be used, please contact the Property Manager immediately afterwards. Because they are dry powder extinguishers, areas affected with powder must be cleaned thoroughly and immediately. The powder is corrosive on all surfaces if left in contact, and the Villa staff would prefer a quick response approach to the situation.

Your cooperation in this would be much appreciated by the Owners. Thank you.



#### FARTHOUAKE

In the unlikely event of an earthquake please follow these instructions:

#### Indoors

- Drop, cover and hold: drop to the floor and cover your head and neck with your arms.
- Avoid windows, hanging objects, mirrors, tall furniture or the TV.

#### Outdoors

- Move to a clear area if you can safely walk.
- If you are on the beach, move to higher ground immediately as earthquakes can cause tsunamis.

#### CYCI ONF

In the unlikely event of a cyclone warning for the island, our Property Manager will make contact with you and advise you on what action to take.

#### **TSUNAMI**

A local earthquake may generate tsunami waves that can reach shore in minutes. If you are on the beach immediately evacuate by walking or driving to higher ground, if driving, follow the 'tsunami evacuation' signs which are displayed all over the island and take you inland from the ring road. Do this if:

- The earthquake shakes so much that you cannot stand
- Shaking lasts longer than 20 seconds
- You notice the water receding from the Shoreline
- Officials issue a tsunami warning
- Remember if an earthquake is long and strong, get gone.





A First Aid Kit can be found in the kitchen cupboard above the fridge freezer.

For medical assistance you can visit the Rarotonga Hospital phone 22664. This is a short distance from the Villa, on the inner Road and it is signposted. Please note there are costs involved. Please consult with them directly.

If you would like to visit a private Doctor please contact Dr Teariki Noovoa on +682 20835 and his surgery is located in Nikao.

The nearest pharmacy P.H.A.B. is a 5 minute drive away from the Villa next to the Oasis 24 Hr. Convenience Store and petrol station. Others are located in town at the C.I.T.C. Department Store and Cook Islands Pharmacy and there is also a smaller pharmacy at Muri.

An AED defibrillator for your use in an emergency can be found in the garage.

It is voice driven, so follow the directions once you have opened the box.

It will lead you through step by step.

NB. Make sure you and the patient are dry – very important; otherwise the user may suffer an electric shock from the patient.

#### WATER SAFETY

Please be careful and vigilant when swimming in our pool, especially if you have children.

Also take care when swimming in the beaches and the lagoons and look out for the 'No Swimming' signs that you may see near the passage areas, as these have strong currents and a strong under-tow. When in doubt 'Ask a Local'.

There are very few marine organisms to be worried about, especially if you exercise caution. The waters are warm, the marine life is colourful and active, and the reef offers protection from ocean swells. Problems generally arise when people tread on or pick up dangerous animals. If you are walking about in the shallows of the lagoon it is sensible to wear thick-soled shoes, both to avoid coral cuts and Stonefish stings. If you see an interesting animal it is better to just look rather than to pick it up. Here is a list and some photos of some potential dangers that you should be aware of when enjoying the sea life, with a brief explanation of what to do in case you do get a sting/bite.

Fire Coral: immediately put warm water on the affected area, then vinegar.

Crown of Thorns: put affected area in water. The pain, swelling and bleeding will dull over time. Eels: vigorously wash out wound and then disinfect. See Doctor if it turns red.

Stonefish, Lionfish and Scorpionfish: soak in water immediately and seek medical assistance, as you will require anti-venom.

If in any doubt or if pain persists, seek Medical Assistance as soon as possible.

# DRIVING AROUND RAROTONGA

The maximum speed limit is 30km p/h in town and 50km p/h outside of the villages. There are no parking meters or peak hour!

If you hold an overseas drivers licence for a car and are hiring a car you are not required to get a Cook Islands drivers licence – however if you do not hold a licence for a motorbike and plan on hiring one you must get a licence and take a test at the Police Station. The Cook Islands Police Headquarters in Downtown Avarua is open to visitors for licences from Monday to Friday 9.00am - 2.30pm and on Saturday from 9.00am - midday.

## BUS

Rarotonga offers a reliable and efficient bus service. There are three buses: the clockwise bus; the anticlockwise bus and the night time bus. All buses have their own schedule. Adult one-way \$5, Return \$8 / Child one-way \$3, Return \$4. You can flag the bus down and please try to have exact change but the Drivers do give change. www.busaboutraro.com

#### MARKETS

There are two main Markets in Rarotonga.

The Muri Night Markets are open on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday each week from 5.00pm – 9.00pm. Here you can find a great selection of local food, often for no more than \$10. There are usually some free cultural performances you can watch while you eat and enjoy the atmosphere.



On Saturday mornings half of Rarotonga congregates at the Punanga Nui Market to shop, eat and socialise. The market begins at 7.30am and is finished by 1.30pm. Our recommendation is to get there early. Fresh produce is sold from the back of utes, grilled meats flame on open barbecues and women sit behind their stalls threading flowers into stunning necklaces and headdresses. There is an ATM in the closest block of shops, within walking distance of the Villa.

Credit card facilities are available in Rarotonga in most shops and retail outlets. Please note there is usually a surcharge added when paying by card.






