Tying the knot

The legal age to wed in Fiji is 18 years. An application for a marriage licence must be made in person to the nearest Registrar Office or District Court in Fiji at least three working days prior to the marriage. Please note, weddings may not be performed on Sundays or public holidays.

The art of taming wedding day hair

Tropical climates can create a number of challenges for brides wanting the perfect wedding day "do". *Pacific Romance* called in Denarau-based, Leanne Goff from Totoka Hair and Make Up to give our readers some handy tips for taming hair in the tropics.

Hair is extremely sensitive to humidity - the moisture in a humid climate can get into your hair and once it does, hair will revert to its natural shape. This means straight hair goes wavy and for curly hair, humidity turns it frizzy or even curlier. Taming the frizz can be a big job! So here are a few pointers on prepping your hair for your wedding day and some recommended styles if you're getting married in the warmer months (or if your hair hates humidity):

- Wash your hair the night before the wedding so that your hairstylist can work with clean, fresh hair that is completely dry.
- While hair is damp, add a lightweight oil to your hair to help control frizz. Blowdry your hair in a downwards direction to keep the cuticle smooth. Make sure it is COMPLETELY dry before you step out into hot, humid, and/or rainy weather, no questions - it needs to be 100 percent dry.
- If you really want to give yourself the best chance of success, spray on a humidity-resistant thermal protection spray and lightly straighten your hair after blowdrying.

Hairstyles that work well in humidity

- High bun/low bun
- Braided
 headband
- Fishtail braid
- Messy (or tidy) pony
- Headband and messy bun
- Half up braid
 or twist

Both spouses must be at least 18 years old and not currently married. The couple cannot be related by direct lineage or be French nationals or residents of France. The bride and the groom must each choose a witness who must be 18 years of age or older (if the chosen witness is not present, the mayor's office can provide a witness).

Required documents

- The Marriage of Foreign Citizens in French Polynesia application must be completed.
- A letter signed and dated by both future spouses, addressed to the mayor of the commune chosen for the marriage ceremony.
- A copy of both spouses' passports.
- A certified copy of both spouses' birth certificates.
- A Certificate of Non-Marital Status (Certificat de Celibat) signed by a lawyer, translated into French and legalised by the French Consulate.

 Proof of residency for both of the future spouses (a utility bill or any bill noting names and physical address will suffice). A photocopy of bills for both spouses is acceptable.



From its lustrous black pearls to its jagged, mossy green peaks, technicolour corals and marine life, French Polynesia offers one of the world's most romantic destinations.

Honeymooners will rapidly identify with traditional Tahitian culture, which revolves around a philosophy known as "aita pea pea", or "not to worry". Tahitians are generous and friendly, and their oral legends are as colourful as their pareu garments.

Bora Bora is only one of the islands in the magical archipelago of French Polynesia. It's too expensive to get married there, and it's a long way for guests to fly to, but one look at an image of these tropical islands is often enough to inspire couples looking for a romantically luxurious honeymoon destination.

The island of Tahiti is the first stop for most, and a stroll through the energetic capital of Pape'ete is a lively introduction to French Polynesian life.

Take a trip by car or local transport to the village of Puna'auia to the Museum de Tahiti et des lles, which is dedicated to conserving the archaeology and history of Tahiti, and learn about French Polynesian environment, history, culture and social life, then enjoy a stroll around the Atea Gardens.

And if you're in Pape'ete in the four weeks from June 22, you won't be able to avoid being caught up in the excitement of the Heiva Festival, which celebrates Tahitian culture.





Traditional bands play live music featuring the vivo, a nasal flute made of bamboo, and pu, or conch shells. There are singing competitions completely in the local language, reo ma'ohi, with its unique tones and harmonies, traditional sports like outrigger canoe races, archery and spear tossing, and of course Tahitian dancing, where every hip and hand move helps tell a story.

Tahiti's beaches of black sand provide a stark contrast to the surrounding hues of vivid blue and mossy green, but it's easy to find some shade for a lazy afternoon, or walk around the public market, Le Marche, and buy some handicrafts, fresh fruit or a pareu, the wraparound skirt or sarong worn by many locals.

Staying with the black theme, Tahiti's lustrous black pearls not only complement most women's clothing and complexions, but they are also a great memory jogger. Look out for them in the pearl boutiques around Pape'ete and in many of Tahiti's resorts.

Jeep Safaris will take you deep into the lush rainforest, for close-up views of the island's four highest peaks, along with waterfalls and old Polynesian monuments, before returning to the coast to watch seawater explode through holes in the reef at the Tiarei Arahoho Blow Hole.

As the sun sets, carry on the informality by ordering food from one of the many roulottes situated on the waterfront. The aromas wafting from these mobile caravans are irresistible as their cooks fry, steam or grill thin-crust pizzas, hamburgers, crepes or waffles long into the evening.

A popular national dish is poisson cru, or ia ota, which consists of raw tuna or other fish marinated with lime juice and soaked in coconut milk, along with onions, lemons, tomatoes and other local produce. Tasty freshwater shrimps, called chevreffes, are also tasty and popular.

But the real attraction of the cuisine around the islands is the fine dining in the resorts and restaurants, with beautiful sea views during the day and a wonderful ambience at night, complemented by a high level of service from attentive staff.

Dinner is often a gastronomic experience, with mouthwatering menus that may combine tuna with wasabi, shrimp with foie gras gravy, or vanilla sauce over grilled mahi mahi, which were all on the menu recently at Le Coco's.

MOOREA FOR ROMANTICS

The island of Moorea is a mere 30 kilometres or a short, fast ferry ride or flight from Pape'ete. The excitement grows as you near the island, and the hazy silhouette on the horizon takes a more distinctive shape. Eight dynamic mountainous peaks rise from its glassy lagoon, while two bays split the northern shore.

Picnics on one of the many motu are popular for honeymooning couples, or at the other end of the scale, try skydiving for an exhilarating experience.

It's easy to rent a car and discover the local villages and beaches, or take the inland roads to one of the island's pineapple plantations. There are also Jeep tours, or ride tandem on an all-terrain vehicle and learn about Tahiti's natural vegetation or gaze out from a lookout.



PLACES TO STAY

Sofitel Moorea la Ora Resort

The Sofitel Moorea la Ora Resort reflects Tahitian hospitality infused with French style, with rooms overlooking the garden and the beach, as well as over-water bungalows.

The gastronomic restaurant, K, overlooks the lagoon, for an intimate and romantic setting, while Pure, the hotel's main restaurant, has an expansive deck for al fresco dining, and live entertainment every evening. Vue is the more informal poolside spot for cocktails and light meals. The wellness centre, Le Spa, is a tranquil retreat with a range of treatments.

Hilton Moorea Lagoon Resort and Spa

Kayaks and jet skis are two ways to get around on the water at the Hilton Moorea Lagoon Resort and Spa, which is located on a beach between the two northern bays, so couples can enjoy both the sunise and the sunset. The spacious bungalows are set among the exotic flower gardens or suspended over the lagoon, or guests can gaze out over the edge of the infinity pool. The two restaurants serve traditional Polynesian and international dishes, while the over-water Toatea Bar is ideal for engaging in a French crepe.

L'Hotel Les Tipaniers

Situated on the northwestern coast of Moorea is L'Hotel Les Tipaniers, at the mouth of Opunohu Bay. It's unpretentious but comfortable bungalows are situated only a few steps from the beach. Some of the bungalows by the beach or the garden have their own kitchen for couples who wish to maintain their independence while they explore Moorea.

The two restaurants offer a wide selection of dishes, including French and Italian. Among the most popular are the lamb with goat's cheese, or the home-made, nourishing vegetable soup.

Manava Beach Resort and Spa

Guests staying at the boutique Manava Beach Resort and Spa have plenty of options for romance and relaxation. You can have a sunset cruise with cocktails on board a comfortable catamaran, or cruise out to the lagoon and swim with rays and multi-coloured fish. Each over-water bungalow has a deck, while each garden bungalow has its own private plunge pool.

The Mahanai restaurant has a refined ambiance, and is noted for the pastry chef's desserts, while the Matiehani Bar Lounge is the place to be on weekend evenings to sip wine and enjoy good music.Massage, or taurumi, is an integral part of Tahitian life, and the Manea Spa carries on the tradition with its special solar-heated pool for aquatic massage, known in Tahitian as rumiavai.

LUXURY ON BORA BORA

Bora Bora is further out from Pape'ete. Its isolation, rugged mountain chain with Mt Otemanu as the highest peak, simply adds to its mystique and attraction for honeymooners looking for the ultimate escape.

You will feel relaxed moments after arriving at the airport after the 60-minute flight from Pape'ete, as you will be greeted with a smile and a fragrant lei placed around your neck before you step onto the boat which will transport you to your resort.

Visitors can enjoy almost every type of water activity, from snorkelling among the coral to parasailing, kayaking and paddleboarding, or hire a little boat and make your own way around the lagoon.

There are some great snorkelling spots, some of them within the resorts, but one favourite is known as the "lagoonarium", a natural aquarium where you can snorkel under the supervision of marine wildlife guides. But those who are cautious about going under the water have another option.

The Bora Bora Aqua Safari Helmet Dive has special helmets for people to put over their head with their own air supply, so they can walk carefully, on the ocean floor and watch all the marine activity going on around you.

PLACES TO STAY

St Regis Bora Bora

For those who really want to get married here, regardless of the cost, St Regis Bora Bora has not only a breathtaking location but also a team to help make everything happen.

The Bridal Boutique has a wide selection of wedding attire, and has developed a partnership with the Polynesian designer Hani Haring, who will work in advance with brides who wish to customise their own wedding dress.



Four Seasons Resort Bora Bora

Diners at the Four Seasons Resort Bora Bora are spoilt for choice. The menu of the Arii Moana, set within a soaring thatched roof, has a strong focus on seafood, including spiny lobster, yellowfin tuna cooked on Bora Bora's volcanic stone, or green curry mahi mahi. The Fare Hoa Beach Bar & Grill has an informal beach club setting and a range of top wines from France, the Napa Valley, Italy and New Zealand.

The walkway to The Spa is redolent with the scents of sandalwood, frangipani and tiare, while many of the treatments include native monoi oil, tamanu, vanilla and honey.

Sofitel Bora Bora Marara Beach Resort Hotel

Not many resorts have seven names in their title, but the Sofitel Bora Bora Marara Beach Resort Hotel also has a long list of attractions. Two of them are its own Eco Lagoon Tour, where couples can swim with rays and sharks, then calm down over a Polynesian barbecue picnic.

And just two minutes away by private shuttle is the resort's own private island, not just a tiny motu but a wild botanical garden of lush plants with a panoramic view of the lagoon. The Latitude 16 restaurant offers local specialties cooked in an authentic Tahitian oven, while the Hurricane has more informal dining and poolside snacks.



BEYOND THE FRINGE

Further out from Pape'ete, on the fringes of French Polynesia, are other islands for honeymooners who want to escape far off the beaten track and delve deep into Tahitian culture and history.

The islands of Raiatea and Taha'a, which share a common lagoon, were the starting points for Polynesian seafarers heading for New Zealand and Hawaii. Huahine is the former home of Tahitian royalty and has numerous ancient marae, or meeting places, while Rangiora's lagoon is the second biggest in the world and has some of the best diving and snorkelling in French Polynesia. There are opportunities to meet stingrays and harmless lagoon sharks, kayak or paddleboard on crystalline lagoons, or experience a pearl farm or a vanilla plantation.

The *Haumuana* has a guest limit of 24, attended to by 13 crew, so it's a very intimate form of cruising. There are two cruising options, each lasting four days, each with plenty of time for excursions. Honeymooners can enjoy picnics on virgin white sand, or arrange to be dropped off on a deserted atoll for the afternoon.

Every crew member on the *Haumuana* is proud of their tradition and culture, and will happily pass on their knowledge and skills of weaving leaves in baskets, traditional dancing, songs and drumming techniques, or how to paint on a pareu.

For a different experience again, the *Aranui 5* has a dual role, as she offers all the comforts of a cruise ship but also operates as a supply ship on her 14-day cruises. All the 254 passengers dine together, then relax in two lounges, four bars or around the pool with a glass of Tahiti's Hinano beer, or listen to guest lecturers describe Tahitian life and history.

Her 254 passengers have ample shore time while cranes transfer cargo, and they can try fishing, riding on horseback, tours of local villages and schools, or go bird-watching.

Sailing on the *Wind Spirit*, with her sheets free to catch the trade winds, is an exhilarating experience for her passengers, including snorkelling down to select their own black pearl in Raiatea. Popular highlights include exploring Fakarava, a biosphere reserve where some of the animal species are found nowhere else on Earth, and a private feast on a beach with fire-dancers providing the entertainment.

And for couples who want to be totally independent, there is always the option of chartering a cruising yacht, and sailing to one of over 100 islands with Dream Yacht Charters Tahiti

They have a fleet of seven monohulls, and 20 spacious catamarans, all based in Raiatea, carefully chosen for its location away from noisy, crowded main towns.

The yachts range in size up to the spacious Lagoon 620, which can comfortably sleep up to 12 people in six cabins.

Couples can rent a cabin with ensuite and share the experience with only a few others, rather than hundreds, while the professional crew handles the sails and the chef prepares the meals, which may be a mahi mahi caught right off the stern an hour or so earlier!

On a crewed yacht charter you are the only guests on board, and are free to decide your itinerary with the captain, while your hostess prepares your meals.

If one or both of you are competent sailors, the ultimate is a bareboat charter, where it's just the two of you, sailing free and easy to the places you've both dreamed of, charting your own course around the islands of French Polynesia while you map out your own future.

Nelly Grange, We Do Tahiti

How long have you had this company?

I started the company in February 2014, so it's almost been four years.

What sort of lead-in time do you require to get married in Tahiti?

For those wanting to get married legally in Tahiti, ideally they'll start the paperwork process four-six months before the planned wedding date; everything must be received in Tahiti 45 days before the wedding (at the latest) so this is not something you can plan last-minute. If you'll just be having a celebratory ceremony, there is no lead-in time really but the earlier the better to ensure the availability of your favourite vendors on your date, and for me to have enough time to write your personalised ceremony. I did write ceremonies on very short notice on a few occasions though, when couples have simply fallen in love with the place and decided to marry on the spot!

How many weddings do you do a month?

This can vary as there are slow months and busier ones, but I try to do no more than four-six a month in order to be 120 percent into each one! I exclusively do personalised and never do the template ceremonies you'll be offered in the resorts, so that requires a lot more planning / writing / coordinating time and energy. I'll always do my best though to accommodate every inquiry.

What are the unique things you can offer?

I am not a magician but I strive to offer anything my couples envision for their special day. It can be a unique location (up the Belvedere lookout in Moorea, in the middle of the Blue Lagoon in Rangiroa, places no one got married at before, I am always up for a challenge) or unique entertainment for the wedding reception (think *Cirque du Soleil* acrobat pouring Champagne into the guests' Champagne flutes from the air).

What are the main benefits of getting married in Tahiti?

It's beautiful everywhere you go! The people and the wedding vendors I am working with for my couples are amazingly talented, friendly and welcoming, and of course the French savoir-faire (aka food and wine!).

What do you enjoy most about your job?

Reading my couples' love stories (I am not overly romantic but who doesn't love a good love story?) and taking part in their special day. People in love and making the most of their trip to Tahiti.

What's the biggest challenge of your job?

Being kind of lost in the middle of the Pacific... Shipping goods to Tahiti is extremely costly so we need to work with what we have. Forget about those very delicate flowers you see all over Pinterest, we're under a tropical climate so we have some limitations in terms of what we can do. This forces us to think outside of the box and different, which is also a good thing.

What are Top 5 things a planner needs to find out from a couple?

- 1. The location (island) where they'll hold the wedding
- 2. The planned wedding date
- 3. Their ideal budget for the day
- 4. The style of event they're after
- 5. The size of the event (approx. number of guests)





What are some of ways you can personalise a wedding?

There are many ways, but the most important part in my opinion is the ceremony! This is often left to chance (you know, those template ceremonies I talked about...) while this is what the day is about! You don't want to find yourself being embarrassed by what is being said (whether the ceremony is performed by a resort staff or by uncle Joe) and want the ceremony to be about you, and to reflect who you are as a couple. Other areas that can be personalised are how you make your guests feel welcome to Tahiti, and of course the design / styling of your event.

Whats is the best advice you would give a couple?

Trust a wedding professional to guide you through the planning process. Planning a wedding isn't easy, so planning it from afar isn't any easier.

What makes Tahiti a great place to get married?

As I said above, it's beautiful everywhere, and you have a great variety of landscapes / backgrounds for your photos. Beach, mountains, nature, forest... it's very colourful and there are lots of activities available to make your destination wedding and vacation memorable.

Do you help with honeymoon plans too? If so, where would you recommend a couple to go to?

I've been in Tahiti for over 15 years and have been lucky to travel to most of its islands so I am always happy to make recommendations to my couples on where to stay, depending on what they enjoy most. I am not booking travel arrangements though, just planning weddings!

What's your key tip to avoiding wedding day stress?

Trust a wedding professional to handle the day and to take all the wedding stress off your shoulders. When you have a good wedding day time-line in place, there's no room for any stress at all.

What is the best time of the year to get married in Tahiti?

I would say any time, as Tahiti is very beautiful year-round, but I don't take weddings myself in January and February, which are the summer months when it's hotter and very humid (it can be rainy as well).

Do you have any memorable unique wedding stories you

On the edge of the Pacific Rim of Fire sits the very special country of Vanuatu, home to more than 80 lush islands, postcard-ready white sand beaches and a fascinating ancient culture where the majority of people still live a village lifestyle. Its warm climate, stunning natural surrounds, ease of travel and beautiful simplicity provide the perfect location for romantic escapes and weddings.

Tying the knot

Getting married in Vanuatu is a straightforward process. However, it's a process that's best started a few months ahead. First, an Intended Marriage Form needs to be filled out – the resort's wedding coordinator will be able to pass this on to you – and then this form needs to be lodged with the Vanuatu government at least 28 days prior to the wedding day. From there a couple will need to be in Vanuatu at least three working days prior to the wedding.

- Plus the following will also need to be provided:
- Birth certificates and valid passport
- Divorce papers (if applicable)
- Death certificate (if a previous spouse has passed away)
 One witness for each person to prove your identity









WELCOME TO NATURE'S PLAYGROUND

Port Vila on the island of Efate, is the commercial centre of Vanuatu and the first touchdown for visitors. Surrounded by a beautiful natural harbour and with stunning views from its lush hillsides, the capital hums with locals going about their business and tourists exploring its fantastic choice of French-inspired eateries and shopping. It is also Vanuatu's centre for adrenalin enthusiasts – with parasailing, ziplining, kayaking, surfing and jet boating just some of the many experiences on offer.

While Port Vila has more than enough to offer in the natural beauty department, with its acclaimed diving sites and marine sanctuaries (snorkelling the marine sanctuary on Hideaway Island is a treat!) those wanting to go further afield for more remote activities and sightseeing opportunities can do so easily with day trips from the capital.

Vanuatu is home to many active volcanoes. A short plane ride from Port Vila is Tanna Island, where visitors can experience the natural fireworks of Mt Yasar. It takes just 45 minutes to hike the mountain on foot, or those wanting a more chilled-out adventure can park their four-wheeldrive just minutes from the crater rim. All will be rewarded with the spewing of hot magma skyward every few minutes.

Diving and snorkelling enthusiasts will find their paradise on Espiritu Santo Island (Santo). Just a 10-minute boat ride from Port Vila, the island's rich World War II history has left a playground of wrecks to explore. Million Dollar Point offers tonnes of dumped surplus army equipment (Jeeps, plane parts) ready for an underwater investigation.

As well as being a natural oasis, Santo has a fascinating history. During the war, the pretty island was home to 40,000 US troops, who used the island as a base for supplies and recovery. Alongside rich ecosystems, with coral that teems with vibrant marine life, is a wealth of wreckages for snorkellers and divers to explore.

The most famous is the *SS President Coolidge*, the world's biggest, most accessible wreck. The US luxury liner was being used as a troop ship during World War II, when she struck a mine and sank, killing about



5000 people. Experienced divers can visit the stern at 60 metres where you can see the ship's letters, propeller and rudder.

As well as diving, visitors can hike to war remnants, kayak or cycle the coast, explore caves and experience unique vegetation and wildlife.

A favourite for visitors is to paddle a traditional outrigger canoe to spectacular blue holes, where they can swing from giant banyan trees into the freshwater spring. Santo has some of the best accessible beaches. Champagne Beach is a must with its soft white sand and turquoise water.

In terms of accommodation for weddings, honeymoons and romantic getaways, there are plenty of options in Vanuatu. They range from large brand name resorts to beautiful boutique properties – the only difficulty is choosing which one to stay in.

What sort of lead-in time do you require to get married there?

We prefer approximately two months' notice, as wedding documents must be lodged with local Vanuatu authorities three weeks prior to the wedding date. This isn't usually a problem, as most couples book well in advance, but we have been known to create amazing events with short notice too.

How many weddings do you do a month?

We host at least two weddings a month, which is wonderful. We receive about three wedding inquiries per day for 2018 and even 2019, which is exciting!

Tying the knot

The legal requirements of getting married in the Cook Islands are straightforward, but there a few things that Kiwis should note:

- If a bride or groom is under the age of 21 they will need written parental consent.
- An application for a marriage licence must be made in person to the Registrar of Marriages at least three working days before the wedding, New Zealanders cannot apply for a licence before they arrive.

57

Applicants for a wedding licence must produce a passport, and if divorced, a copy of the Decree Absolute.

Each month varies, however we host between 65-75 weddings per year.

Tying the knot

In 2009 a change in policy meant that couples visiting New Caledonia could hold a civil wedding ceremony. Applications are made to the Nouméa City Authorities at least six months in advance, via an email to the Townhall Records Authority. There are several legal documents required such as proof of civil status, a Certificate of Residence, passports and birth certificates to name a few. An officially approved translator (French/English) will be present at the ceremony. After the ceremony, a certified transcription of their marriage certificate then needs to be taken to the consulate of their country.





NOUMEA

Noumea is the charming cosmopolitan capital, with close to 100,000 people who call it home. A relaxed city on a peninsula surrounded by a beautiful bay, it offers a vibrant French-inspired dining scene and fabulous shopping. It remains the hub for most holidaymakers because as well as its natural beauty it offers so much to see and do.

French wine, macaroons, fine cheese, escargots – French food is a true recipe for romance. New Caledonia is a celebrated foodie haven with a unique fusion of French and Island flavours to be found in the bounty of romantic restaurants here. From fine dining to Parisian-style bistros, to the local markets, Noumea will not disappoint in its offerings.

The newest addition to Noumea's restaurants is "So Food" on Lemon Bay, which has fused local and Mediterranean influences to create something delightfully unique - try a savoury tuna or beef tartare cut to order.

One of Noumea's most famous restaurants is Au P'tit cafe, on Avenue des Freres, and for good reason. This cafe has no menu, instead four new dinners and desserts are on offer each week to suit the seasons and to keep the chefs' creativity at its best. The one thing that does stay the same is the passionfruit cheesecake – and locals will tell you this is an outstanding choice!

For a dining experience with a view, visit Le Roof, a restaurant serving New Caledonian/French-style seafood fare in an over-water bungalow. You may just see dolphins swim by while you dine.



For a true Parisian café experience, head to Chez Toto in Noumea's Latin Quarter. The bistro serves quality French cuisine - cassoulet, lamb shanks, crème brulée and even escargots in a classically chic setting.

La Pirogue in the Chateau Beach Resort and Spa in Mauritius is the place to go for seafood in Noumea. With views to the lagoon and garden, couples can enjoy a romantic taste of the Pacific, such as prawns and pineapple in rum and coconut milk.

Fancy staying in or enjoying a picnic on the beach? Take a trip to the markets or fine food stores in Noumea and pick from French wines, patés, terrines, fois gras, duck cassoulets and of course an array of French cheeses. And be sure to pick up a selection of Patrick Morand's famous chocolates from his boutique store in the Latin Quarter for dessert. Moselle Market, beside the marina at Port-Moselle, is Noumea's biggest and you'll find your souvenirs there too.

Be sure to visit Noumea's bakeries (boulangeries) and patisserie – the bread is wonderful, and the croissants, macaroons and eclairs are mouth-watering.

ILE DES PINS

The Ile des Pines is a peaceful escape, less than hour plane ride from Noumea. Nicknamed the "island closest to heaven," this is a popular honeymoon destination for good reason. There are no Instagram filters needed at Kuto, Oro, Upi and Kanumera Bays. Their pure white sand and turquoise water has to be seen to be believed. Collecting



jaw-dropping romantic memories here is easy - visit the highest point of the island, N'ga Peak, for a stunning view, ride together on a floating outrigger cance or swim in the natural seawater pool near Oro Bay, which has been created by a simple barrier of rocks. You can take a day trips to IIe des Pins from Noumea, but locals recommend at least three days to experience the island's magic. Be sure to try the IIe des Pines' famous snails - Escargots de l'IIe des Pins. They live in the forest and are farmed by the locals. You can only consume this delicacy on the island.

THE LOYALTY ISLANDS OFF THE BEATEN TRACK

For couples who want to leave the common tourist route and visit an area relatively untouched by tourism – the Loyalty Islands is the place to go. Visitors won't find shopping or large fancy resorts here. Instead they'll discover a true example of traditional Melanesian culture, and the pristine untouched natural beauty of an island that was formed from raised coral-covered in dense scrubland. Accommodation is in the form of smaller resorts, many with traditional huts, or there is the option of home-stay accommodation with locals.

Lifou

This is the largest of the Loyalty Islands and one of the most dramatic landscapes in New Caledonia, with the steep coral cliffs, long stretches of white sand beaches (the most famous is Chateaubriand), small coves,



limestone caves and grottos. Spend time together on the outstanding beaches, check out the vanilla plantations, and visit Lifou's immense cave - Grotte Jila, where locals used to hide during tribal wars.

Enjoy hikes inland through the lush tropical forests that have formed on a vast plain that used to be a lagoon. Diving couples will want to explore the sites off the coast of the Hunete tribe's land.

Ouvea

This beautiful atoll of Ouvea is a World Heritage site confined by a series of reefs and islets called the Pléiades. Only 35 kilometres long and less than 40 metres wide in some places, there is only one road on the island which winds along the lagoon, shaded by palm trees.

Couples can hire a scooter and explore this paradise, where the pristine waters are dwarfed by the majestic Lékiny Cliffs. The lagoon is home to abundant wildlife, and is a wonderland for kayaking, snorkelling and swimming. Formed by an atoll that tipped over, it is partly underwater.

Maré

Maré is the highest of the three islands – with steep cliffs and dense forest. Visitors will discover little sand coves nestled between impressive rocky headlands such as the legendary Warrior's Leap in Wakone. Snorkel among multi-coloured fish, take in the delightful spectacle of the beaches and explore the Petheon and Meduy Caves.

Maré is "untouched", even by Loyalty Island standards, and couples who want to immerse themselves in the island and its people will discover a rich culture and history.



PLACES TO STAY

Le Méridien Noumea Resort & Spa

Overlooking the crystal clear waters of Anse Vata Bay and just a few minutes from the town's vibrant centre is Le Méridien Noumea Resort & Spa. Walk out your front door into the large swimming pool, surrounded by tropical gardens, and then straight on to the beach where you can swim, kayak, snorkel or paddleboard. This is a water lover's delight. Also on the doorstep is the starting point of the Pierre Vernier track, the famous Caledonian jogger's highway, for those who fancy a scenic run. Alternatively, opt for a lie down and make the most of the onsite spa with a couples massage.

Couples getting married are offered expertly prepared catering and dedicated wedding staff with a smorgasbord of venues. There is the charming beachside La Chapelle, a unique octagonal building with arched stained glass windows for ceremonies of up to 40 guests. For bigger weddings there's Salon Lapérouse, which accommodates 250 people, with a dance floor and floor-to-ceiling windows. For outdoor affairs, Le Faré is a beachfront restaurant with a thatched roof. It accommodates up to 100 guests for dinner and dancing as the sun sets over the bay.

Civil unions are permitted and recognised internationally, however they can only take place in Honiara.

A RICH HISTORY

For a place so untouched – the Solomon's has a rich history with one of the highest concentrations of World War II wrecks in the world. Some of war's fiercest battles took place in the Solomon's, where strong resistance from Australian and American forces pushed the Japanese back.

The battle sites have had minimal interference and visitors find rusting tanks and Jeeps as well as caves that were used as hiding places and observation points.

Couples who want an historic underwater adventure will find ample opportunities. The ships, submarines and aircraft that are submerged here serve as artificial reefs, attracting coral and fish and offering a fascinating underwater museum to explore. You don't have to go far from the capital to experience it – try the aptly named Iron Bottom Sound, just off Honiara, where some of the wrecks are also shallow enough to be snorkelled.

THE DIVING PARADISE

The Solomon Island's waters are home to an abundance of coral and tropical marine life and have been nominated as one of Oceania's seven natural wonders. Located within a wider area known as the Coral Triangle, the reef is made up of 500 species of hard and soft corals and the water is a spawning ground and migratory route for reef fish, dolphins, rays, sharks and marine turtles.

Maravo is the largest saltwater lagoon in the world and many of its islands are uninhabited; couples will find the peace and privacy of the often deserted beaches a total treat.



One of the most beautiful unspoiled locations on the planet comprising a vast group of 992 breathtaking tropical islands, the Solomon Islands is the perfect place in which to enjoy a truly memorable wedding ceremony, the perfect honeymoon or a romantic getaway for two. Munda and Roviana Lagoon are also popular. Inside the Roviana Lagoon, which is enclosed by a chain of barrier reefs and islands, adventurous couples can visit the Cave of the Kastom Shark, where a small, freshwater pool leads into two large connected chambers.

For those couples who love to dive, or who want to learn to dive, a handful of beautifully located resorts provide an idyllic doorway to undersea ventures like you will get nowhere else.

PLACES TO STAY

Tavanipupu Private Island Resort

For a premium island delight visit Tavanipupu Private Island Resort in Marau Sound, just a 25-minute plane ride from Honiara. Couples will find a tropical paradise with manicured lawns, lines of coconut palms (leftover from its days as a coconut plantation) and spacious bungalows in a coconut grove overlooking the beach.

The restaurant is renowned for its fresh seafood, and the resort offers fabulous snorkelling, fishing, diving and swimming opportunities. The resort is a popular spot for honeymooners and couple's escapes, and hosted one of the world's most famous duos - The Duke and Duchess of Cambridge (William and Kate).

Evis Resort

On the lagoon side of Nggatirana Island is Evis Resort, one of the Solomon's newest properties. The tree-lined luxury beach resort in Nono Lagoon is made up of beachside bungalows with a bar and restaurant at its centre. The island has 15 hectares of conservation land, which couples can walk the "round the island trail", enjoying the birdlife and forests. There is kayaking and snorkelling gear available and day trips to Vangunu Island, which has easy access to premium diving and snorkelling sites, including Penguin Reef, Rapichana Point and Hele Bar.



Vangunu is home to Gerbera's village Zaira, one of the most remote places on earth. Fatboys Resort

Tonga is the destination for couples who want a truly secluded tropical escape, with only 40 out of its 146 islands inhabited. The beautiful Kingdom is warm all-year-round, but the temperatures rarely reach above 35 degrees, and trade winds from the east provide cooling breezes in the late afternoon and evening while you relax together, overlooking the turquoise ocean.

Despite Tonga's isolation you will not be lost for romantic adventures here. Tonga is one of the few places in the world you can still swim with the whales. Many are mothers with calves so great care is taken not to intrude. There are a number of providers who will do whale swimming tours but be sure to use licensed operators, so you know your guides are using sustainable practices, fully trained tour guides and correct equipment.

Then there is the world-class sailing, diving and snorkelling. While you cruise around the warm water you may just do so with the soundtrack of whale song and be joined by sea turtles, manta rays, tuna, marlin and wahoo, and whale sharks.

Those wanting a rustic adventure can camp overnight on deserted beaches or stay in a simple island village in the company of locals. Others who want more creature comforts can opt for the kingdom's boutique resorts and eco lodges which offer a stunning environment to relax and rejuvenate.

TONGATAPU

Tongatapu, home of the capital city of Nuku'alofa and residence of Tonga's Royal Family, is a great springboard for your Tongan adventure and offers a host of activities to begin your couple escape.

Enjoy the rugged beauty of the Anahulu Caves and then stand together on black volcanic rocks to witness the Mapua 'a Vaea blowholes, which spout water along six and a half kilometres stretch of wild coastline. Spectacular. Visit Tonga's own "Stonehenge" - the Ha'amonga Trilithon. These three giant limestone slabs are too large to have been moved by mortals, so folklore has it the trilithon must have been made by the demigod Maui. Then continue the wonderment by heading to the north of Tongatapu, where you can watch the resident pigs heading out for a swim at low tide. It's all truly otherworldly.

VAVA'U GROUP

Your escape to Tonga's paradise is not complete without heading to the Vava'u Group, a tropical oasis of 61 islands with deserted beaches, coral gardens, transparent lagoons and some of Tonga's must-do attractions.

Join a local skipper and enjoy the sheltered yachting playground that attracts sailboats from around the world. Once on board, you can visit hidden coves and atolls or take part in game-fishing for mighty blue marlin.

Snorkelling or diving is bliss in these crystal-clear waters. The beauty is visible up to 30 metres, and visitors can explore shipwrecks, sea caves and the abundant underwater life.

Sharing a tropical holiday with your loved one is special, but sharing the warm waters of Vava'u together with gentle humpback whales is extraordinary. Vava'u is one of Tonga's most popular whale swimming destinations from June to November, when whales come to care for their newly-born calves.



EUA

For an entirely different landscape, take a seven-minute flight from Tongatapu to Eua, an island millions of years older than the rest of the Tonga group. The eco-paradise is home to steep limestone cliffs, caves and waterfalls. Hike in Tonga's biggest national park, breathe in the fresh air of lush rainforest and be sure to listen out for the call of the koki, Eua's rare redbreasted shining parrot. For divers the highlight of visiting Eua is one of the Pacific's largest underwater caverns, which is a natural amphitheatre.

PLACES TO STAY

Fafa Island resort

This exclusive beach resort is situated on an 18 acre palm covered atoll, surrounded by a marine-reserve coral reef, just a 30 minute boat ride from Tongatapu. Stay in one of the 13 traditional Polynesian fales, all made from natural materials. Couples will love the honeymoon, deluxe and superior fales which are located just steps away from the private beach with views out to sea. Visitors can also take a day trip from the main island and enjoy lunch at the resort and a day snorkelling and swimming on the private island.

The Hideaway

This rustic but beautifully located accommodation on Eua has 10 rooms surrounded by lush green forest. Couples will love the six ocean-view rooms which look out to the vast blue sea, and enjoy soaking up the scenery on The Hideaways ocean-front viewing deck, the perfect place to take in the visiting whales or the sunset, with a drink in hand.

Marriages in Samoa are legally recognised worldwide. To marry in Samoa, you will need to fill in an application for a marriage licence at least 14 days prior (but no more than three months in advance) to your wedding day with the Ministry of Justice in Apia. A fee of ST\$14 applies (subject to change). You will be required to provide a photocopy of your passport, birth certificates, death certificate (of past spouses) or a copy of the Decree Absolute if divorced, and a Certificate of No Impediment to Get Married (from your country of origin). "Beautiful Samoa" is the catchphrase used to promote the islands of Samoa to the world. It's a simple description, but it's also very accurate. Indeed, Samoa has a flair for the dramatic. Mountainous volcanic peaks rise above lush green valleys. White sand beaches and secluded bays dot spectacular coastlines. Tall waterfalls spill into rivers that carve their way through the countryside. For romance travellers, Samoa's stunning landscapes provides the perfect backdrop to celebrate love.

UPOLU – ADVENTURES ABOUND

Let's get this straight. There's absolutely nothing wrong with lazing poolside or flopping on the beach. In fact, it's good for the soul. But if a couple picks Samoa for their romantic adventure, they should at least set aside some time for adventure.

Taking a plunge into the To Sua Trench on Upolu's south coast is a must. This giant swimming hole is on the southern coast of Upolu among tropical gardens that are meticulously maintained by the local landowners. To access this surreal swimming hole requires climbing down a high ladder. Some might find the descent a little scary, but if you go slowly there's nothing to worry about. Once at the bottom, it's just a matter of diving in and enjoying the view back up.

Exploring Samoa by bike is also loads of fun. And because couples aren't whizzing by in a car, there are plenty of chances to soak up the local culture while you're sightseeing. There are numerous familyowned markets dotted along the main roads, selling fruit and local produce. Simply park the bike, put the feet up and savour the taste of a coconut that's been cut fresh that morning. Along the coast there are plenty of swimming holes too, so packing the togs is a must.

SAVAII – WALK ON THE WILD SIDE

With Faleolo International Airport being located on the "main" island of Upolu, it's only natural that many romance travellers stay there, and don't make the trip across to the neigbouring island of Savaii. Which is a shame, because Savaii is home to some pure, unspoilt serenity.

For overseas visitors, Upolu will seem pretty cruisy. But in comparison, Savaii is even more laid-back. Some locals describe Savaii as Upolu from 30 years ago. For some visitors, it is the version of Samoa they prefer.

Visiting the island is easy. The inter-island ferry leaves from Mulifanua Wharf, about 10 minutes from the airport, and arrives at Salelologa within an hour. Salelologa is the main town, so it's the best place to buy food and drinks, rent a car and get any other supplies.



Savaii is the largest of the Samoan islands and home to some stunning scenery. Active couples will love the Tafua Peninsula Rainforest Reserve - a nature-lover's paradise, where lush rainforest meets the rugged, lava-streaked coast with its sea caves, sea arches, blowholes, flora and fauna.

The reserve has some scenic walks, including a hike up to the Tafua Savaii crater. Savaii is also home to some magnificent waterfalls, including the Afu Aau Falls, which is hidden in thick rainforest. The falls crash into a natural swimming pool, making it a great spot for a relaxing dip. Access is via a 20-minute walk, or you can get right up to the pool in a four-wheel-drive vehicle.

When the swell is hitting the southwestern coast, the Alofaaga blowholes put on a brilliant show, as the sea forces its way into the blowholes and shoots up to 30 metres high.

The locals sometimes throw coconuts into the holes, which are blasted into the air like they've been shot out of a cannon. The entrance to the blowholes is at the Taga village.

Samoa is a great place to get married because of its tropical weather all-year-round. Personally, I would choose a beach wedding, because the sound of the distant waves creates a romantic ambience.

Do you help with honeymoon plans too? If so, where would you recommend a couple to go to?

What's your key tip to avoiding wedding day stress?

Always take notes, have a checklist ready for what you need to do and tick off every time a task is completed.

What is the best time of the year to get married in Samoa?

Tying the knot

A couple must obtain a marriage licence when they arrive in Hawai'i. This can be done from a marriage licence agent (there are many agents on each island and they can be found online or an appointment can be arranged by your wedding coordinator). Note: you have to appear together to obtain the marriage licence. As a rule, there is no waiting period for your licence, it is granted on application.

- Bride and groom need to be over the age of 18 years otherwise a birth certificate and written consent from both parents, a legal guardian or a family court judge is required.
 Proof of age – Passport, drivers licence or birth certificate.
- If either partner has been married before, a divorce decree is required.
- Once the marriage licence is obtained, you have 30 days to get legally married in Hawai'i.

Hawai'i has become much easier for romantic travellers to visit – with the number of flights going up and the price of flights coming down. But while this improved access has been a catalyst for putting Hawai'i firmly back on the map for New Zealand travellers - the variety, quality, service and sheer beauty of the Hawai'ian Islands will no doubt keep visitors coming back for more.

THE BIG ISLAND

Want to add a little glow to your romance? You can try it with gold, or head to the island of Hawaii, known as The Big Island, and the Volcanoes National Park.

Rivers of bright orange lava pulse vividly against the recently cooled black rock before striking the ocean with the sizzle of a million steaks. The park is one of the state's most popular visitor attractions, with the focal point being Kilauea, one of the world's most active and accessible volcanoes.

The Crater Rim Road, which circles the caldera, or crater, passes several of the top attractions in the park, including Devastation Trail, Jagger Museum, Thurston Lava Tube, and the visitor centre, along with several viewpoints over the volcanic landscape.

The lava tube is accessed from the eastern section of Crater Rim Road down a short trail that leads through a forest. The 150 metre tube, which is illuminated, was formed by lava cooling at different rates as an eruption took place.

The drive west leads to the Kona Coast, home to Hawaii's renowned Kona coffee and the quaint town of Holualoa. Taking a tour around a coffee mill is fun. Couples will see how the beans are processed, and of course they can experience the rich aroma and flavours. Holualoa is also a popular art centre, with funky galleries and boutiques selling paintings, ceramics and handcrafted woodwork.

Mauna Kea Beach Hotel

KAUA'I

Sitting at the top of the Hawaiian chain, Kaua'i is a paradise for couples who love getting among nature. Here lush rainforests thrive, valleys and mountains have been weathered into spectacular forms, rivers snake their way across the countryside, waterfalls burst with life, and there's even a Pacific version of the Grand Canyon. It's no wonder Hollywood producers filmed Jurassic Park and Pirates of the Carribean against this backdrop.

The mountainous interior and sheer cliffs of the North Coast have made it impossible to build a road circling the island - in fact, only around 10 percent of the island is accessible by car. This may sound like a hindrance, but for couples, it's actually a blessing, as it means much of this beautiful countryside is reserved for hikers, bikers and kayakers.

The 18 kilometres long Kalalau trail along the Na Pali Coast is Kaua'i's most famous hike and it's considered one of the very best in America. It runs from Ke'e Beach and goes through deep green valleys and along towering sea cliffs, before ending in the Kalalau Valley. Most hikers will break the journey into two sections with an overnight camp at the half way point. The steep terrain does make this a challenge. The other way to see Kaua'i is by helicopter. In fact, taking a mindblowing aerial tour of Kaua'i should really be compulsory for any couple. Companies such as Blue Hawaiian Helicopters operate out of the island's main airport in Lihue.

With rock music playing in your headphones, the pilots whisk you away for a 50 minute highlight package that includes the Waimea Canyon, Na Pali Coast, Bali Hai Cliffs, Hanalei Bay and Mount Waialeale - one of the wettest places on earth! Once again the scenery is simply amazing, plus the tour gives you a snapshot of the entire island and ideas of where to go to once you're back on land.

Kaua'i was once the domain of sugar barons, but while the plantations are no longer in operation you can still experience this rich history at Kilohana Estate on the outskirts of Lihue, Kauai's biggest town.

The beautiful old mansion house has been converted into a museum, plus it has an open courtyard where visitors can sit down and enjoy lunch, dinner or Sunday brunch.

The estate is also home to the tasting room and shop for the locally made Koloa Rum. This boutique distillery was only established in 2009, but has gone on to win numerous national awards. Needless to say, a sampling session is a must.

With fewer than 70,000 residents on Kaua'i, the pace of life couldn't be more relaxed. And because tourism development arrived here later, the visitor experience remains authentic. Indeed, this is a place where couples can enjoy the laid-back local lifestyle surrounded by the glory of a natural wonderland.

St Regis Princeville

This exquisite five-star property is considered one of Hawaii's best. Sitting on the shores of Hanalei Bay, couples can expect butler service and just about every other luxury you can imagine.

How long have you had this role?

The Best Hawaii Wedding was launched in June of 2016. As the owner of this company and Hawaii Bride & Groom Wedding Style Magazine, I have been in the wedding industry since 1990 in many roles.

What sort of lead-in time do you require to get married in Hawai'i?

Norfolk Island has become a food-lover's destination with its fresh fish, succulent beef and pork as well as boutique products like coffee, honey and local cheese. It offers a true farm-to-table experience with almost all the fruit and vegetables being grown on the island.

Local specialities include banana pilhi - a savoury slice made with green bananas, coconut bread, and mudda, which is green banana dumplings in coconut milk.

For scenic dining visit Bedrock Café, a hidden paradise 10 minutes out of town. Feast on local produce and the spectacular ocean views, and wander through the beautiful gardens. Bedrock Cafe also offers cheese platters and wine, pamper packages and the Bedrock boutique fish feast - an intimate cliff-side dining experience with Bounty descendants with traditional island seafood fare.

For another distinctive Norfolk Island experience, try Island Nectar's traditional island degustation-style dinner. Here, local host Binky will take diners on a taste journey through the Norfolk culture by preparing traditional dishes around a communal table. If couples prefer dinner for two, Island Nectar can prepare an island-style picnic hamper.

For something special, try high tea at the Forrester Court, a multi-award winning property on the cliffs overlooking the beautiful Cascade Bay, or visit la Perouse for a romantic candlelit dinner and innovative seasonal meal overlooking the hotels' gardens.

ISLAND ACTIVITIES

Norfolk Islanders celebrate their history and one of the must-do activities on the island is to visit the Georgian buildings and ruins that make up the convict site, which is the oldest in Australia and a World Heritage site. If you are inclined to a round of golf, Norfolk Island offers the world's only gold course on a World Heritage site. The nine-hole course offers stunning views from every hole.

About six kilometres from Norfolk Island is a small pile of basalt that has risen from the ocean floor – this is Phillip Island and it is home to thousands of whale birds, black noddies, and large masked boobies. It's a beautiful place to visit for a walking tour and to get up close to its remarkable bird life.

For some of the best views of Norfolk Island, take a kayak tour around some of the island's most spectacular coastlines. You'll see giant basalt and sandstone formations, visit sea caves and cruise through natural rock arches.

PLACES TO STAY

There are a range of charming locations to marry on Norfolk Island, including luxury cottages and homesteads. For the ceremony there are sweet local churches, as well as incredible scenic locations.

As far as romantic destinations go, Niue doesn't dominate the headlines like some of its more glamorous South Pacific neighbours. Neither does it want to. Niue is proud to be low-key, and that's the way couples love it.

Affectionately nicknamed "The Rock", this picturesque piece of raised coral is home to people who will welcome you like you're one of the family. They'll wave to you every time you drive past. They'll sit down and have a yarn while you're eating their fresh seafood at a local café. This is one of the beauties of romantic travel on Niue. It's 100 percent real.

For couples after glitz and glamour, sorry, you've come to the wrong place. But those searching for a destination that offers peace, quiet, outdoor adventure and the chance to immerse yourself in a genuinely hospitable South Pacific community, Niue does quality time like few others.

GO AT YOUR OWN PACE

With a population that sits somewhere around 1500 people, Niue is quiet, even by South Pacific standards. Despite the superbly laid-back vibe, there are more than enough activities to keep a couple occupied. And you can simply do things at your own pace. Often without another person in sight.

Stroll to the cathedral-like Matapa Chasm (one of the island's many swimming holes) for a snorkel and there's a good chance you'll have the place to yourself. The locals will joke - "man it was busy today, I went for a swim and there was one other person!" The funny thing is, they're not kidding.

Unless you come from a really remote part of New Zealand, this peace and quiet feels foreign. But for "townies" it doesn't take long to get into Niuean mode. My advice - just kick back and embrace the pace of Niue life. You'll love it.

DIVE ON IN

Being a raised coral atoll, there are no rivers or lakes, and its centre is a plateau – the remnants of the original lagoon. No rivers or lakes also means no sediment in the water, which means that the water clarity is exceptional – making for amazing snorkelling and scuba diving for couples.

Couples can just grab a rental car, a map and go exploring. All the main swimming holes, caves and chasms are clearly signposted and are often just a minute or two from the main road.

Highlights include the Avaiki Cave. If couples visit at low tide, there is a wonderful swimming cave to the north of the main cave, which is perfect for a sunset swim. The aquamarine pools on the coast at Limu are also a must-visit. It's a natural swimming pool filled with warm, gin-clear water. Dive in and you'll find it's like swimming through a giant aquarium. There are sunshades and a few picnic tables, so it's a great place to pack a picnic and just snorkel, snack and hang out in the sun.





DINING DELIGHTS

Kaiika

Kaiika is a Japanese lover's dream On top of these fine raw ingredients, they also employ a top-class sushi chef direct from Tokyo! The menu consists of a mouthwatering mix of nigiri, sashimi, sushi, chirashi and tempura.

Hio Cafe

Drive north from Alofi for 15 minutes and you'll spot a red shipping container overlooking the sea. That's the Hio Café - the brainchild of Victoria Lakatani. Victoria and her husband returned to Niue after many years working in Sydney and Dubai. Along with the yummy eats, it's a great spot to watch the world go by.

Vaiolama Cafe & Bar

Located in Alofi, Vaiolama matches spectacular sea views with delicious, fresh food. The café offers a full range of espresso coffees, yummy tropical smoothies, shakes, home-made cakes, pastries, delicious sandwiches and more.

Washaway Cafe

You heard of BYO, Well the Washaway Café has invented SYO - serve your own beer, wine and spirits! No kidding, thirsty patrons slip behind the bar, choose (and pour) what they want from the fridge and then write it down in a book. When you leave, a staff member tallies your total and you pay. The self-service angle adds to the laid-back atmosphere.
